CERTIFICATE III IN HEALTH SERVICES ASSISTANCE

This program provides students with the knowledge and experience in relation to working in the health industry to provide assistance to health professionals.

COURSE AIMS

This program is designed for those students pursuing a career in the health industry in the future. The program includes basic training in medical terminology, first aid and health related care.

CONTRIBUTION TO VCAL/VCE

VCAL: One credit towards a VCAL learning program is awarded on successful completion of 90 nominal hours of accredited VET curriculum.

VCE: Students who complete this program may be eligible for recognition of two or more units at units 1 & 2 level and a units 3 & 4 sequence.

ATAR: From 2018, students wishing to receive an ATAR contribution for the Units 3 and 4 sequence must undertake scored assessment for the purposes of gaining a study score. This study score can contribute directly to the primary four or as a fifth or sixth study.

Where a student elects not to receive a study score for VCE VET Health Services Assistance, no contribution to the ATAR will be available.

Please note: The student must already have English and three other fully scored VCE/VET subjects to create the primary four.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS/INFORMATION

Students must undertake 40 hours a year of compulsory Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) to be deemed competent in this program.

1st and 2nd year students have two full day practical sessions a term.
