Furniture Makers are well regarded in the Building Industry, due to their precise attention to detail and experience working with small measurements. They are highly considered when applying for apprenticeships as their accuracy and problem-solving expertise, are valued skills.

Designing and making high quality furniture is the focus of this 'hands-on' program. Students use hand and power tools to create their own physical works of art. Each year students work towards making one major piece of furniture, which they can take home. In addition, they extend their skills by working on smaller projects.

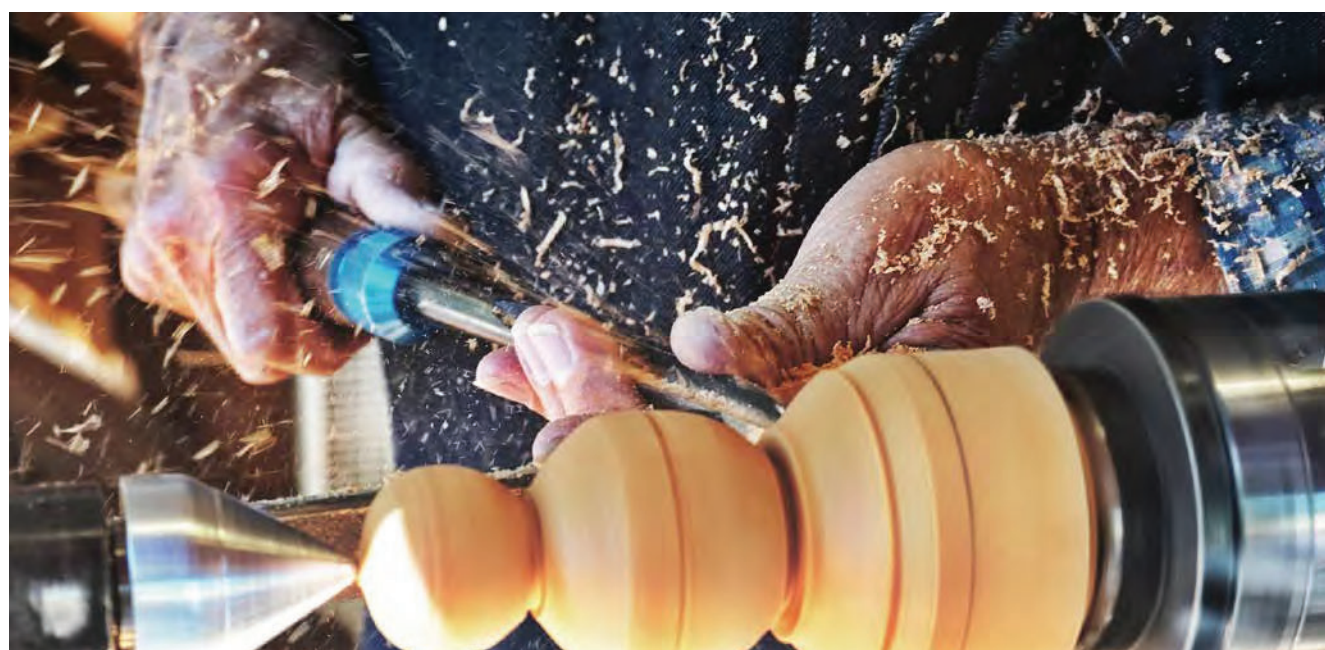
A variety of programs are available ranging from Certificate III to Bachelor Degrees.
