If you love to perform music and already sing and/or learn a musical instrument, then this program may suit you.

Students strengthen their skills as a performer and work towards making effective use of their rehearsal time and develop their own sound as they experiment with improvisation and develop stagecraft skills.

They learn how to create their own compositions/songs, implement copyright arrangements, prepare for engaging performances and make a music demo in a recording studio.

Note: Students may be required to attend a meeting/interview before being officially enrolled into this program. Students are expected have their own instrumental teacher and their own instrument (where practical)

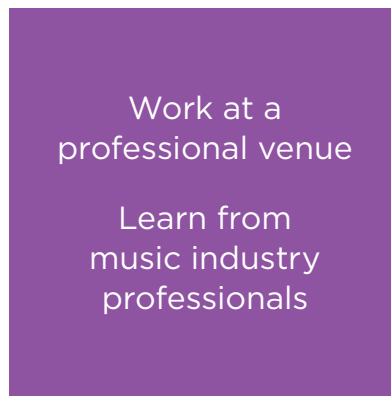
