As a great introduction to the fashion industry, students gain an understanding of fashion design and the production process. Students creatively experiment and extend their love for textiles and the clothing industry, by creating and making their own designs.

Students connect with industry and work towards showcasing their designs in an annual September collaborative Fashion Parade. The designs are modelled and styled with an artistic flair, aiming to flatter all body shapes and increase confidence in the wearer.

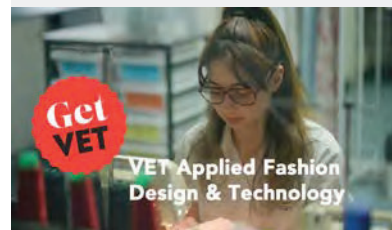
