What it is

If you want to learn about the building industry, from qualified builders, then this program may be for you.

Students learn basic industry specific skills and knowledge to support them to apply for apprenticeships, within the building and construction industry, which operates at a Certificate III level.

Students learn how to carry out basic measurements and calculations. They interpret basic plans and drawings and prepare and apply for work in the construction industry. Students follow workplace safety practices on-site and continually develop their workplace communication skills.

Upon successful completion of the program, students are eligible to obtain:

Your possible career/pathway

Many graduates of the Certificate II Programs gain employment as apprentices within their chosen industry. As an apprentice, students undertake a relevant Certificate III course and real life on the job training with an employer. Many Certificate III graduates go on into further training including Certificate IV, Diploma and Degree level qualifications.

Employment

Job roles related to this qualification include: carpenter, building site manager, foreman, building inspector.
