What it is

This unique learning experience allows students the opportunity to experience the Horticulture, Conservation and Ecosystem Management industries.

Full day classes are at Lake Wendouree, giving students the opportunity to recognise, research and explore living organisms that live and interact with each other in the area.

Students learn about general land conservation and the restoration and rehabilitation of ecosystems. Students collect native seeds, plant trees and shrubs and treat weeds. They learn how to operate a hand-held Global Positioning System (GPS) to track locations and record data.

Students learn about environmental regulations, identify environment issues, and work towards improving environmental practices and resources.
