## RGR20221 CERTIFICATE II IN RACING INDUSTRY

### What it is

This program gives students an introduction to the horse racing industry.

Students learn how to identify horses and horse behaviour; safely catch, lead and tie up a well-educated, quiet, calm, consistent and obedient horse; fit common items of gear and rugs; all whilst under the supervision of an experienced person competent in horse handling skills.

Students learn how to provide daily care for horses. They groom and rug individual horses. Students clean up stables, check and maintain/repair and store working gear and saddlery, according to stable procedures.

Students also learn to care for themselves and others as they prepare to enter the world of work.

*Note: This program is intended as a pre-requisite for some Year 10 and all VPC students who want to study the two-year VET Cluster program 22647VIC Certificate III in Equine Studies. Year 12 students are welcome to apply for this program.*
