### What it is

This is a hands-on, action-packed program that involves several activities indoors, but mainly outdoors. This is an active and energetic program.

General workplace skills are taught in the context of an 'outdoor recreation' environment. Due to the many excursions and outside environments required to assess students, this program is delivered for a full day on a Thursday during the school week.

This program provides students with the skills and knowledge to be competent in working in an outdoor recreation environment and assisting with conducting a range of outdoor activities. In addition, core skills, such as teamwork, communication and contributing to the health and safety of others, can be applied to many different workplace settings.
