## What it is

Interested in learning about being a 'tradie'?

This 12 month program gives students the opportunity to try their hand at two trades, carpentry and bricklaying.

Students learn how to lay bricks and masonry blocks, using a variety of bricklaying hand tools and equipment and handling of associated materials. Students will lay bricks to construct walls, whilst learning how to undertake construction work safely.

As per the photo on the following page, the learning area is undercover, heated and organised.

Students also learn how to safely use carpentry tools and handle carpentry, working on their projects in a classroom environment and the Carpentry skills workshop.
